## POINTS TO PONDER

The custom of saying "I'chaim" is found in the Gemara, and is considered a prayer for the other person's continued long life.

"Mazal tov" is a prayer that the auspicious occasion of the other person should help him fulfill his tafkid – his purpose in life.

Deuteronomy 28:2 And all these blessings shall come upon you and overtake you, if you obey the voice of the LORD your God. (ESV)
